
Connectedness with nature





- Thematic analysis of significant experiences
- ❖ 1450 reported experiences
- ❖ Diverse and personal!

So what is connectedness?

- Discovery & surprise (Curtin 2009)
- Unique vs. everyday (Richardson et al. 2015)
- Special place vs. home
- Undisturbed vs. encounter
- Beauty vs. hardship
- Deep immersion vs. joy of the outdoors (Bell et al. 2018)

So what is connectedness?

- **Learning** as relational or utilitarian value?
 - ❖ Developing relationship (Cosquer et al. 2012)
- Stewardship through contributing to research and conservation
- **❖Social** aspects? Bell et al. (2008)

- This is not purely instrumental, but also relational
- \diamond The human-nature connection is personal \rightarrow empirical work to understand its richness
- Organisations can take these relational aspects into account in project management
